Grades

Exams

Homework

You are encouraged to collaborate on homework assignments. Collaboration means working together to frame problems, devise approaches, and compare results. However you **must** write up the final solutions individully and separately to ensure that you understand the material yourself.

Most weeks there will be a quiz in recitation. It will be similar to the homework problems you turned in earlier in the week. The two lowest quiz scores will be dropped. There will be no make-up quizzes.
