**Making an Impact on Climate  
Through a Career at the EPA**

As a graduate student, Kristen Taddonio often heard that environmental issues were a trade-off: companies could pursue profits or environmental protection, but not both. Now, six years later, Kristen is using her position at the EPA to prove that profitability and climate protection oftentimes go hand-in-hand. As head of Strategic Climate Projects, EPA's Climate Protection Partnerships Division, she works with businesses and organizations to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by saving energy, switching to climate-friendly refrigerants, and speeding market adoption of emerging technologies.
