**Economic Incentives for Upstream / Downstream
Ecosystem Restoration**

Upland watershed management is just one part of the overall land and water management problem. This presentation looks at this larger problem through the lens of water, ecosystem services and biodiversity. This approach helps to clarify where watershed management fits in water resources management. The emphasis of the presentation is on explaining how economic tools – valuation, incentives and trading regimes - and an understanding of policy/legal realities help shape opportunities for management and restoration of our watersheds and water resources more generally. Specific attention is given to new initiatives to use payment and market-based approaches to restore watershed services and environmental flows.
