Seeing Superfund Clearly: Choosing the Right Lens

Superfund will soon be 25 years old. What has it accomplished and how? How much has it cost and why? The answers to these questions should guide future decisions on reauthorization and/or reform, but these answers will be strongly influenced by the analytical 'lens' that is used. In the past, three separate lenses have been used to look at Superfund: the hazard lens, the cost/liability lens, and the risk lens. In this seminar, Alex Farrell will discuss results from the first attempt at a comprehensive analysis of the benefits of the Superfund program, which required developing a new analytical lens. A brief discussion of costs and the resulting policy implications will be included.
