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Modern Dairy Production Issues

Dr. Galligan will discuss the historical evolution of the dairy industry in the US. The economic basis of these changes will be covered (consolidation, capitalization, animal management practices and the implementation of technologies to improve yield/animal). These changes are occurring worldwide and are expected to continue into the future as the demand for dairy products increases in developing countries. Modern dairy practices and technologies will be discussed in terms of their impact on societal concerns as well (animal welfare, environment, food safety). Disease issues will be discussed in terms of their prevalence over time in the dairy industry. Dr Galligan will discuss the term “production diseases” in terms of it’s appropriateness to the dairy industry - are disease concerns increasing as a consequence of production or is the term “production diseases” a misnomer?
