Overview: This double-credit course takes students through the first year of Greek, introducing morphology, syntax and short readings. Intensive exercises in grammar, Greek composition and translation from Greek to English (prepared and sight) develop the students' ability to read Greek with facility. At the end of this course, students will be ready for second-year Greek classes. Note: completion of this course fulfills the first half of the Penn language requirement. No prerequisites.
