

Courteous Reader,

HAVE seriously thought whether the portending influence of the planetary systems are to be noticed or not; but since the eclipse in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty seven exhibits so much pretence of destructive and desolatory events, it may perhaps be of infinite benefit to the public in general, to set forth the grand predictions of this eclipse, though some few individuals may think them not worth their attention.

fiructions in the watery vessels.

It will have much influence on men's tempers and dispositions, and influence them in respect to their conduct in moral and political matters, in nations, provinces, towns neighbourhoods and families. Great tumuits and contentions will arise. Civil wars will prevail in feveral countries, and feveral parts of America will fuffer great diforders on account of the expensiveness of law, taxes, &c. There will happen great jumbles and dilorders about public officers. Factious men will find much fault with the leaders or commanders of the states, Tavern haunting will much prevail, and of course drunkenness, overreaching,

many more of such like things are naturally predicted which may God of his infinite wif-

dom and power prevent.

The natural effects of the ecliple in June, celebrated in the fign gemini, in the 24th degree and fix minutes of that fign, fun's declination north, 23 degrees 20 minutes accending, and is a fign of the airy triplicity, a double bodied fign, and portends contentions and diforders, between parties, both by iea and land. But as Mars, the God of war has removed his fituation towards his own country, which is France, its effects will be mostly upon the trads of the feas, where there will be mighty battles fought, and a multitude of severe engagements between parties and it is more than probable that the feat of war will be mostly on the seas according to Mars.

But as to the ecliple of the lun June 15th being projected almost in our zenath, it will wonderfully assect North-America with quarrels and contentions of a workke nature, the savages of different tribes, will be induced to make intoads upon our frontiers, laying waste many of our towns, villages and new plantations, which will for a time ninder the extension of the line of jurisdiction of the United States. By the malign influence of these colliptes, the United States of America will be troubled with intestine jars, and imestic quarrels, and contentions of every kin even to destroying the ties of friendship, and folving

folving the bonds of love and kindred, to the utter ruin of families. Setting hulbands against their wives, and wives against their hulbands, and one neighbour against another. The consequence of which will be vexatious and ruinous law suits, envy and hatred will prevail, and designing factious knaves will persuade the unthinking to rise in opposition to government, despising Rulers, Magistrates, and Judges. New scisms will take place in the church. Ministers of the sacred gospel will be contemned and despised for a limited time, but the earth is the Lord's, who is able to bring order out of consumon.

As to the other eclipses which are not villed ble in our hemisphere, as their influence is foreign to us, I wall not tay any thing about

them.

These things and many more are the natural predictions of the planetary system, but as the Lord commanded nature in the days of Joshua, for the good of his people, so may is please than to order times and leasons for the good of his American Israel.
